ACTION PLAN:

Increase Visible Leadership

Increase your engagement at safety meetings and safety events

Walk around onsite and engage in meaningful conversations with employees about safety

Invite other leader(s) to increase engagement in safety meetings and safety events

Perform Mini Assessment

Review your safety dashboard for relevance and usefulness

Review your organization's "safety artifacts" for alignment (policy documents, executive safety summary, etc.)
